Intro: Life is like a voyage -

and often our ship encounters unexpected storms. From an actual storm that Paul faced at sea, we can see an example of *HOW TO STAY CONFIDENT IN A CRISIS*.

I. WHY WE EXPERIENCE "STORMS" IN LIFE

* WE LISTEN TO THE WRONG EXPERTS.

(vs. 11) "... they followed the advice of the pilot and owner..."

*WE JUST SETTLE ON DOING WHAT IS POPULAR.

(vs. 12) "... the majority decided that we should sail..."

*WE RELY ON CIRCUMSTANCES.

(vs. 13) "When a gentle south wind began to blow, they thought they had obtained what they wanted..."

II. HOW "STORMS" TEND TO AFFECT OUR LIVES

- 1. STORMS CAUSE US TO DRIFT.
- (vs. 15, 17) "... so we gave way to it and were driven along..."
- 2. STORMS CAUSE US TO DISCARD WHAT WAS ONCE PRECIOUS.

(vs. 18-19) "... they began to throw the cargo overboard..."

3. STORMS DRIVE US TO DESPAIR AND LOSE FAITH

(vs. 20) "... we finally gave up all hope of being saved..."

III. WHAT TO HOLD ONTO IN A "STORM".
